

Provide a <u>brief description</u> and <u>purpose</u> of the request for the expenditure from this Division Restricted Account: Since January 1 2023, Operations-Valley Bureau (OVB), has seen a significant increase in catalytic converter thefts. In just 115 days there have been 865 catalytic converters stolen in OVB, an average of 8 catalytic converters per day. In recent years, the value of precious metals located inside the catalytic converter have skyrocketed. OVB, home to 7 geographic patrol divisions, has hosted etching events that mark the 17 digit vehicle identification number (VIN Number) onto catalytic converters. The purchase of a VIN marking device will allow OVB to host marking events on a frequent basis. Marking the VIN number on the catalytic converter deters criminals from stealing the device. Moreover, if each division in OVB hosted just two marking events a year, and marked approximately 200 catalytic converters per event, OVB would have marked a total 2,800 vehicles per year; a small investment to deter such a prolific crime.

NAME OF REQUEST: JL Catalytic Converter Marking Machine

It is requested that Operations-Valley Bureau (OVB) be approved for the JL Catalytic Converter Marking Machine. Approval of this grant benefits the Department as follows:

Theft of catalytic converters have been on the rise. The value of precious metals that are located inside catalytic converters has skyrocketed. Unfortunately, as the value of the precious metals continues to increase, so does the number of thefts of these devices. For the vehicle owner, repair costs and alternative transportation acquisition can range between \$1000 to \$4000. Removing a catalytic converter takes only minutes using essential, readily available, battery-operated tools from any hardware store.

The JL Catalytic Converter Marking Machine is designed for law enforcement agencies to engrave a 17-digit vehicle identification number (VIN) in under 30 seconds to exhaust components. Catalytic converter marking events help reduce these types of thefts in the community, build stronger partnerships with community members, and assist detectives with catalytic converter theft investigations. After the VIN's barcode is scanned via the JL Marking application tablet, the registered owner's contact information is stored in the machine's software that can be accessed by Detective personnel for prosecutorial purposes, should theft of the catalytic converter occur. Felony criminal charges are likely to be filed by the District Attorney's office if victims can be located and contacted.

Marking events, historically held on Saturdays allow community members to take advantage of this service at no cost, have proven to be an effective theft deterrent of catalytic converters.

To allow OVB's seven patrol Areas equal access to the marking machine for marking events, the OVB Community Outreach Unit (COU) will house the machine at OVB headquarters and coordinate the machine's deployment throughout the Bureau. The OVB COU will ensure Area personnel are trained on using the machine before each marking event. There will be a policy in place that will require the machine to be returned to OVB on the Monday following the marking event. An accountability log will be maintained at OVB to document the event location and the number of marked vehicles.

There are no anticipated maintenance needs for the marking machine. However, additional funding will be sought to repair the device if the device requires service.

There are no warranty or service contract fees associated with this donation. Additional funding will be identified if the marking machine becomes inoperable or requires servicing.

One device is valued at \$6,574.38 (\$6,004.00 +\$ 570.38 in applicable CA sales tax, see attached invoice). A complete marking machine includes one marking machine, tablet, application software, protective case, (2) Makita batteries, and charger.
